Fertilization and controlled how much water greens received, and corrected the PH going into the SPRAY TANK.



We used 2 carriage bolts through the buckets with bolts using a metal bar for support.



This gives me a clean better cut and ups the green speeds some. Helps if I have to spray them after mowing and there is no time to roll them.



When we overseed the greens the lines really show up. The end result is, this does not cost a lot of money to make.

Quick Fast Inexpensive solid Tines

Aides with getting products into the soil and or just opening up the soil. Sometimes you will get scaring just as with solid tines.

I will run this over the green and will follow up with a mowing of the green.





For me it's about getting things done the best I can, at the same time getting the results as if you had the right (expensive) equipment


I try to give the clean up pass areas a little extra. Sometimes we will go just up and back with no turning on the green. Just go by feel . You get the same look with solid tines after mowing. In the photo. All I did was run the mower over the area, reels down not running.



Localized Dry Spots Are You Fighting Yourself ?

Run water on my green for 3 minutes it will receive 1/8 of an inch

Run it 5 minutes and the greens will receive .025 inches of water



Are your **high** areas getting the same amount of water as your **low** areas



Do you even know?

This is my moisture meter, its made for potted plants in a nursery. Isn't a green a large potted plant. Used with a soil profiler. The profiler is one of your most effective tools you



Taking a soil sample



This water meter will save you money and give you some piece of mind

If you spray 50 gal/A. Then 25 gal equals ½ an acre. Is your spray rig level when you load. Is your golf cart level when you load So many uses. Gal (h2o) to product ounces. Pesticides, Herbicides, Fungicides, used in 5,10,15,20,30 gallon spray tanks



This is helpful when you are spot spraying areas with your spray rig Use what you need. Not so much extra product left over

Rain Gauge


This works for me and my operation. I set it at ¼. If it starts raining at 11pm and it's over ¼ of an inch, it turns off the pump. Cost 20.00.





My pump runs from 11:30pm to 8am. I do modify it in the summer. There are many reasons why I do this.

Old Rainbird 1970, click click click My irrigation controller when I started



Same box you can get for your house

I use three programs

A- tee/fairway B- greens C- daytime both A&B



Existing wires into new box Used existing control box



Walkway from behind green to tee box. Compaction, water not draining well.

Quick aerification or venting Remember it's the end result that matters




I did three tee boxes in a few minutes





Good depth for a roller ,soil factors determined this and how much water is in the roller




The core is being slug out at a good speed

The results are just about as good as a brand name unit

After mowing



After mowing



Its not as good as a name brand but does get the job done for low buck



GROOMING: on a flat surface place each plate under each corner of the rollers

Adjust till they just touch the floor, using paper as a feeler gauge

Toro sells them in packs of four, in different thicknesses



This is cheaper then a gauge , a good starting point.

Keep the bottom of your hand spray pump somewhat dry and steady

I put the 5 gal bucket in a milk crate to hold it steady



1 inch pvc pipe keeps the spray pump off the bottom
